I have been approached by a group of young lawyers who have created an organization named the Climate Change Lawyers Network. Its mandate is to advocate for a stronger climate change commitment throughout Canada and particularly within the legal profession.

I support and applaud their efforts and believe that as lawyers, that we have a powerful role to play and the expertise to make a lasting contribution to the collective response to climate change.

Legal professionals will play an important role as Cap-and-trade, carbon taxes, offset and allowance credits, mean that carbon is likely to become the newest commodity. However, carbon finance and trading is only one of many approaches to solving this unprecedented environmental crisis. In addition to environmental protection, the climate crisis will influence Canada's approach to responsible corporate governance, ethical business practices, and the protection of human rights.
